From Mayo to Santiago de Compostela

FATHER and daughter, Peter and Natasha Murtagh, will speak at a public meeting in Galway tonight, Tuesday January 24 on their 900-kilometre trek along the famed pilgrim path of the 'Camino de Santiago de Compostela'. Their story inspired them to write a book, 'Buen Camino', which has received a lot of media attention and they are coming to Galway to support local Heart and Stroke Charity Croi who are currently promoting two charity treks on the Camino one in June and the other in September of this year.

Peter and Natasha started their five- week journey by scaling Croagh Patricki and ended up in the magnificent cathedral city of Santiago de Compostela in north western Spain.
