€1.4 million for road works

MINISTER of State Michael Ring has announced from the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport funding towards specific projects, as follows:

Bunowen Bridge rehabilitation works -€239,000; R319 Tonragee East and Owenduff realignment - €495,000; Killala inner relief road - €100,000; Newport Road accommodation works - €100,000; Mount Jubilee bridge rehabilitation and widening scheme -€295,000, and Behy Bridge - €29,515.

Also approved is funding for Cummer Bridge - €69,172; Derrinloura Bridge - €10,896; Derryhillagh Bridge - €14,584; Doolough Bridge - €17,025; North Beltra Bridge - €10,896; Srah Bridge - €4,199; Srah Bridge - €1,702; and Fahy Bridge - €17,025.

The total funding being allocated to these bridge projects is €1,404,017.
