LONGBOARDING IN LUXURY

Not too posh to paddle? The luxury Maldives resort of Gili Lakanfushi has opened a surf school on the North Malé Atoll, one of the best surfing spots in the Indian Ocean. Run by Tropicsurf, it offers expert instruction for all ages and levels, complementing the five-star experience of the resort, where you can retire to a villa and dine on gourmet cuisine in the evenings, waited on by a butler. WILDLIFE INVESTIGATIONS

The Freshwater Detective, aka Professor Ken Whelan, has teamed up with Delphi Resort to create a weekend workshop experience at Aasleagh Lodge in Leenane, Co Mayo: an off-piste adventure exploring the ice roads and hidden river valleys gouged out by glaciers millennia ago. He will point out the presence of predators such as otters and mink, discuss how herons, cormorants and seals interact with 10,000-year old populations of sea trout and salmon, and you will hopefully come face to face with some of the most fascinating creatures around the Connemara waterways. You will also learn to read a river corridor, a river channel or a lakeshore. Three weekend Freshwater Detective courses will run on August 26-29, October 7-9, and November 18-20. ◄ WOODEN IT BE NICE

Blackberry Wood in East Sussex looks as it sounds, like the setting of an Enid Blyton novel. Here, accommodation includes a fairytale treehouse with a sky-high turret and terrace, a double-decker London bus with a soft-play area (which converts into a second bedroom), a helicopter and a curvy cabin. The campsite is in South Downs National Park, about 15km from Brighton, and costs from €96 per night based on two adults sharing, while children aged 3-15 can be added for €6 a night (prices apply between September 12 and October 31). Return flights from Dublin to Gatwick start at €34 per person with Ryanair, based on a September 14 departure. blackberrywood.com





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UNDERWATER SCOTLAND

Just reading about this one made us chilly, but then we're soft: more adventurous types will be tearing off to the northwest Highlands and plunging head first into Scotland's first-ever snorkel trail. It features nine beaches and bays on the coast of Wester Ross and Sutherland, with a supporting leaflet showing the best spots and what you can expect to see. Note: dead man's fingers and bladderwrack are marine life rather than conditions you might pick up. scottishwildlifetrust.org.uk





◀ OFF THE BEATEN TRACK

Rügen is a small, friendly, laid-back island off Germany's Baltic coast, with Iron Curtain roots but eccentric charm. With 600kms of sandy shoreline and reliable sunshine, it's one for hobby cyclists in particular, with a full-circle route of country lanes and quiet paths sporting views over towering chalk cliffs and quaint fishing villages. Bizarrely, there is also a ghostly holiday camp commissioned by Hitler. A selfguided one week cycle tour starts at €1,130pp based on two sharing, including seven nights' B&B in two three-star hotels and two four-star hotels, five dinners, route maps and cycling notes, luggage transfers between hotels, cycle hire with accessories, and return crossings from Schaprode to traffic-free Hiddensee and back to Stralsund. 


A FINE STRETCH

Mix sailing with yoga and local gastronomy on a luxury cruise in Croatia. The eight-day itinerary includes yoga practice, sailing on a luxurious nine-cabin, traditional Croatian-style wooden gulet, cycling, paddle-boarding, Mediterranean cuisine and island-grown wines. You can visit family farms and vineyards for tastings, hike and mountain bike, or just go for a swim in the crystal blue coves off Dalmatia. Q How much can I milk the free toiletries during a hotel stay? A Yes, we know they're made by a company established in Mayfair in 1946. And they come in smart, travel-sized bottles. But is that reason enough to stockpile them like they're vessels of liquid gold? Arguably, yes. Unless the hotel is on the stingy side, chances are the half-used ones will be dumped, anyway. And you can be certain that the presence of those swanky lotions has been used to ramp up the nightly rate. If you're the sort who shamelessly hoards free stuff, you're unlikely to be forking out for many hotel stays, so go on, make the most of it. Let's not forget, though, that these are the second most interesting miniature bottles you're going to find in your room. But you have to pay for those.

VINO DE SANTIAGO

How far would you walk for a good glass of wine? The second section of the Camino de Santiago, along the French Way, starts in the city of Pamplona via the photogenic pilgrim sculpture at Alto del Perdón, *pictured*, the mountains of Navarra and the red earth vineyards of La Rioja, passing medieval bridges, castles, churches and picturesque villages. The stops are something to look forward to: at Bodegas Irache have a quick sip at the free wine fountain, and finish your walk at Logroño, capital of the Rioja wine region, and try the local tapas. The standard five-night trip starts a €497pp half board. *caminoways.com*
